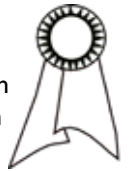

## YOUR JUDGE

**Dr Sarah Broadberry (Ratscallion)**

I have a long-standing interest in Terriers, influenced by my childhood as a daughter of two vets, always having a white terrier of working type in the family. This interest grew with time spent around hunt kennels and the ubiquitous working terrier. I bought my first PJRT at 18, followed by another at 22. These dogs were my companions through university and alongside my vet nursing role. Both dogs were shown at working terrier shows and this continued when I acquired my first working Lakeland Terrier at 28; a breed I have long admired, both working and show types. I am a member of the Lakeland Terrier Club, but so far, I have stayed faithful to owning PRTs. On first meeting my now husband, I fell in love with his Ratscallion PRTs (and subsequently him). I started showing at KC events in 2007 with moderate success. We later evaluated our breeding and bought two puppies in 2015. Our bitch (Alncroft In Tune at Ratscallion) claimed BOB at Crufts 2016 and our dog (Ch Foxthorn Huron at Ratscallion) claimed Top Puppy 2015 and gained his title in 2016. I am interested in all aspects of health, behaviour and nutrition and I am KC Breed Health Co-ordinator for the PRT, JRT and Greenland Dog. In my spare time, I am employed as a Senior Lecturer in animal nutrition and behaviour at Nottingham Trent University. I believe it is our role as committee members, breeders and judges to maintain the working traits of the PRT, whilst recognising the breed now has an increasing role as a family pet.

## DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must at the time of entry be a Member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class, i.e. **Tuesday, 14th March 2017**.

Wins in Variety Classes do not count for entry in Breed Classes, but when entering for Variety Classes, wins in both Breed and Variety Classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations 9(j) and 20.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

**MINOR PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**PUPPY:** For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**JUNIOR:** For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the Show.

**NOVICE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

**POST GRADUATE:** For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or 5 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open Classes whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**LIMIT:** For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit and Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

**OPEN:** For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

**VETERAN:** For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show.

**BRACE:** For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in another class other than Brace or Team.

### **ADVISORY NOTICE**

**NOT FOR COMPETITION:** Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **OPENING OF SHOW:** The Show will open at 9.00 am.
2. **ARRIVAL OF DOGS:** Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. **JUDGING TIME:** Judging will commence not before 11.00 am.
4. **REMOVAL OF DOGS:** Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. **COOKING STOVES:** The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
6. **Entry Fees:** Members First Entry at £4.00 per Dog; subsequent Classes at £1.00. Non-Members First Entry at £5.00 per Dog; subsequent Classes at £1.00. **Brace:** £1.00 per entry. **Junior Handling:** £1.00 per class. **Not for Competition:** £2.00 per dog. **Catalogues:** £2.50 with entries; £3.00 on the day. **Adverts:** Full page £5.00 (members) £6.00 (non-members); Half page £3.00 (members) £4.00 (non-members), plus £5.00 per photograph. **Membership Renewal Only:** £10.00 Single; £12.50 Joint; £15.00 Europe; £20.00 Rest of the World.
7. **PRIZE MONEY:** There is no prize money on offer at this show.
8. **REFUSAL OF ENTRIES:** The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
9. **PUPPIES:** Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible for exhibition
10. **MATING OF BITCHES:** The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
11. **BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:**
  - a. Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
  - b. *Withdrawal from other Competition:* Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition, other than Breed Classes, prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show in order to remain unbeaten. A puppy beaten in competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
  - c. *Proviso:* For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
12. **BEST IN SHOW:**
  - a. The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
  - b. *Withdrawal from other Competition:* Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show may be withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
  - c. *Proviso:* For the purposes of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace and Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
13. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with special permission of the Show Management.
14. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
15. It is not acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. Exhibitors should note that such practices could constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

16. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) - Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
17. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
18. **Dogs in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
  - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
  - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
  - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
  - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
  - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
  - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
  - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. **WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.** Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
19. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
20. No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
21. **DOG FOULING & GROOMING WASTE:** Any owner, handler, exhibitor or other person in charge of dog(s) is required to remove as soon as possible, any fouling caused by their dog(s) and/or any grooming waste at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and their approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling/grooming waste will be provided.
22. **RESPONSIBILITY:** It should be distinctly understood by exhibitors and spectators at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the entire or partial loss or detention of or damage to dogs or any other property whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever or from any act of omission of themselves or their officers, servants, agents or others. Exhibitors and spectators will be held responsible for any damage to property or equipment within the environs of Polesworth Memorial Hall caused by their children or children in their care. It is on this understanding that entries are accepted.
23. **MOBILE PHONES:** The use of mobile phones in the vicinity of the ring is prohibited.
24. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
25. A dog may be disqualified by the General Committee from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge. This shall not apply if a judge has been appointed in an emergency.
26. If any judge is unable to fulfill an engagement the Committee reserves the right to appoint a replacement. In these circumstances, exhibitors may withdraw from competition but no entry fees will be returned.
27. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE

Would exhibitors please note that the sports field outside the hall is

### **NOT TO BE USED FOR EXERCISING DOGS**

The field is nothing to do with the Parish Hall  
and is designated a dog free area by a local bylaw.

Please keep the venue clean and tidy and do not allow your dog  
to urinate against the curtains inside the front door.



Bins will be provided – please use them!

### **DO NOT THROW RUBBISH ON THE FLOOR**

If a dog fouls any part of the Venue it is the responsibility of the exhibitor,  
handler and/or owner to clean it up and place in bins provided.
